Dear Trinity Methodist Family,

A year ago, I shared my heart in our newsletter following the exciting step of our church's new journey outside the Wisconsin Conference of the UMC. As we embraced this fresh path, I encouraged us all to focus on a vital mission: Building bridges within and beyond our church walls.

Reflecting on Our Progress: Building Bridges

Building bridges, as we defined, is not only about forming connections but about merging a web of understanding, support, and unity among us and with the wider world. It is about paving ways that enhance relationships, encourage cooperation, and deepen our sense of belonging. Today, I invite each of you to reflect: How have I contributed to building these bridges this past year?

- 4. <u>Cultural Bridges</u>: In a world rich with diversity, have we celebrated the various cultures within our church family? As John's vision in Revelation paints a picture of unity in diversity, have we mirrored this heavenly scene?
- 5. <u>Social Bridges</u>: Proverbs challenges us to honor God through kindness to the needy. Have our efforts reached the marginalized? Have we been God's hands and feet to those in difficult circumstances?
- 6. <u>Interfaith Bridges</u>: Paul urges us to maintain the unity of the Spirit. Have we sought to understand and collaborate with other faith communities, fostering peace and mutual respect?

<u>Community Bridges</u>: As we interact with the wider community, have our actions reflected the love and service Paul describes? Have we seized every opportunity to do good, especially to our fellow believers?

Who's In the Pews?

Ever wonder who you're sitting next to at church? Want to know a little

more about them and their faith journey here at Trinity? If so, this "newish" contribution may answer a few of your burning questions. This month's spotlight is on John Muentner.

I grew up on our family farm in the Town of Byron with my parents John and Elaine and my sisters Dawn and Faye and my brother Dan. We lived right next to my grandparents Irving and Verna and my Uncle Walter.



I went to school in the Lomira School District starting with the little white schoolhouse in Brownsville. I was there through 2nd grade. Then, I was off to Lomira where I graduated in '76.

We went to church at Ebenezer until Trinity Church was built. I was confirmed here in '72.

My family now consists of my three daughters, Missy, Jenny, and Amanda and their families. I have six grandchildren; two boys Kadryn and Brayden, and four girls; Desi, Audrey, Ella, and Nora. Just as we lived next door to my grandparents, I am blessed to have my daughter Amanda and her family living next to me. Amanda and her husband Nate purchased the old farmhouse from my dad and renovated it. It is a great joy to see the remnants of the farm that they incorporated into the house as well as having my two little ones (Ella and Nora) right across the lawn.



I am a sports nut and enjoy the Packers, Brewers, Badgers, as well as all forms of Lomira high school sports. My favorite memory, of course, is built around a sport event. I was crossing that bridge in the last quarter mile of the '93 Fox Cities Marathon as I realized I was going to qualify for the '94 Boston Marathon, and then actually going to Boston and running it. It took 10 years and approximately 15,000 miles of training to get it

done. Bucket list and life-changing, it opened doors for me in my life for the next 30+ years.

My favorite thing to do as I've gotten older is waterskiing. I love the challenge and excitement of it all.

The biggest lesson I have learned was from my Dad near the end of his life here as he said simply "to live your life with an attitude of gratitude. This will open doors of opportunity beyond anything you could dream of. "

My parents brought me to Trinity when I was young, but what really "brought me to Trinity" was my divorce. This pushed me to bring my three young daughters to church and also encouraged me to get involved. One of the first ways I did that was through the youth group.

In my role as Lay Leader, I am involved in almost every committee as well as ushering, reading and basically doing whatever I can to support our congregation.

In this exciting time of joining the new Global Methodist Church, I would like to see people expanding their commitment and involvement in "all things Trinity" and approach our involvement in serving our Lord and our Mission Field with enthusiasm and love.

Making Disciples in the Philippines

The boys and girls knew to quickly pick up their chairs and scoot to the side, clearing the narrow alleyway anytime a bicycle or motorbike needed to squeeze through. These interruptions to the discipleship class happened often enough that they had become normal, and the children and their teachers carried on with worship and Bible teaching once the traffic had cleared.

The tiny thoroughfare in the middle of the slum was the only space that members of Grace Baptist Church could find to hold The Greatest Journey lessons. But they were undeterred. Every Saturday morning, they arrived to find the boys and girls waiting for them and eager to hear the Bible story they'd come to share.



God is using Operation Christmas Child and The Greatest Journey, our follow-up discipleship program for shoebox gift recipients, to introduce children in this slum in Illoilo, Philippines, to the Gospel. Most of their families aren't Christians, and they had never before had an opportunity to learn about God's love for them.



New Life in Christ

Anne, a member of Grace Baptist, had never worked with children and doubted that she could serve effectively. She even wondered why God had called her to teach The Greatest Journey. But she knew God wanted her to teach, and she wanted to obey.

As the weeks went on, she came to treasure her time leading the boys and girls and watching them become disciples of Jesus Christ.

"We're teaching the kids not only The Greatest Journey lesson, but how to develop daily habits. We teach them how to pray and how to read their Bible," she said. "I believe that if you touch their heart, they can serve the Lord our God."

Ongoing Discipleship

Anne and other church members had wanted to reach the neglected community for a while but they weren't sure where to start. This slum is well-acquainted with hardship, as many people can't find jobs and those who do still don't earn enough to make ends meet. Their small homes are pieced together with wood and bamboo scraps and precariously crammed together. Alcohol and illegal drug use is common.

The church members were concerned about the physical needs of the children as well as their spiritual needs. "Some children go to school without food. These kids are hungry," said Charmaine, one of The Greatest Journey teachers. Her husband is also pastor of Grace.

Operation Christmas Child and The Greatest Journey created the pathway the church needed to begin Gospel outreach among children and parents who desperately needed the eternal hope of Christ.

"This has opened doors for us to talk about Jesus. We want them to have a personal relationship with Him," Charmaine said.

Much to their delight, and even surprise, boys and girls in the slum never tired of learning about God during The Greatest Journey. "Even if it was hot, even if it was crowded, they were so enthusiastic," Charmaine said.

They enjoyed the time so much that Charmaine and Anne wanted the regular gatherings to continue once the lessons were finished. They started a weekly worship and Bible study for the children in Charmaine's home. Even children who didn't participate in The Greatest Journey have become interested in the weekly gathering at her home.

"This has been one of my greatest joys," Charmaine said.


