Dear Trinity Methodist Church Family,

As April unfolds around us, I find myself pausing to notice the quiet miracles of God's creation. While mornings and evenings still carry the crisp chill of winter, with temperatures sometimes dipping into the 30s, our afternoons bless us with warmer breezes in the 50s, gently announcing the arrival of spring. Have you noticed the tulips pushing their green shoots through the cold ground? These small wonders remind us of our Creator's artistry. The Psalmist beautifully declares, "*The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands*" (Psalm 19:1). In this transition from winter to spring, we see our Lenten journey reflected clearly, moving from darkness into glorious light.

This special day marks the start of Holy Week, leading us to two meaningful gatherings: Maundy Thursday on April 17 at 7:00 PM, a special service of remembrance centered around Jesus' commandment to love one another (John 13:1-17), and Good Friday on April 18 at 7:00 PM, a solemn time of prayer and reflection on the sacrifice of Christ.

Then comes Easter Sunday, April 20! We will joyfully celebrate Christ's resurrection with the sermon titled, "What Is Your Own Story of Jesus' Resurrection?" (Luke 24:1-12). On this day, we will embrace the transformative power of the empty tomb, experiencing new life through the risen Christ.

Our regular Sunday services throughout April will also explore inspiring themes:

- On April 6, the sermon "*Worship or Waste*?" (John 12:1-8) will challenge us to consider how we honor Jesus through our offerings and devotion.
- On April 27, "Unlocking Doors of Faith" (John 20:19-31) will encourage us to open our hearts fully to the power of belief, trusting deeply in Christ's presence and peace.

To my beloved Trinity family, your faithful presence is truly a precious gift. Whether you have been part of our church for many decades or just a few weeks, you belong here. As Paul lovingly encouraged, "*May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for one another*" (1 Thessalonians 3:12). This April, may our hearts, just like the awakening earth around us, rise anew in the grace of God.

From the shadows of the cross to the glorious dawn of resurrection, let us walk these holy days together. Every tulip that blooms and each warm breeze gently whispers this joyful truth: **Our God brings life out of death.**


Cemetery Board -Submitted by: Doug Kiehnau Ministries

What is the main purpose of your ministry? We make it available for deceased members and non-members to be buried at Emmanuel, Ebenezer, or Salem cemeteries or have their cremated remains spread in Trinity Woods.

Who are the members involved in your ministry? Glen Wellso, Jan Guell, Dan Michels, Jason Ehlert, Jeff Faber, Clarice Drummond, Doug Kindschuh, Wayde Beck, and myself.

What is a recent project you worked on with your ministry? I've been researching family members who have been

buried at one of our cemeteries that have no available records. I use the "Find a Grave" website along with the Fond du Lac and Dodge County Records to determine who is buried in the unmarked graves.



What are the goals for your ministry? Our goals are to make the family members of the deceased content with our price and maintenance of the cemetery grounds.

How can members become involved in your ministry? Members can step up when a position becomes available on the board. Additionally, they can research unmarked graves or volunteer

information when they know about an unreadable gravestone.

So, we have come full circle. We came to Trinity in the early 70's when we moved to Wisconsin. We church shopped for a few years and found that Lomira was the most welcoming and friendly. We made Trinity our home and met so many people who became "family" to us since we had no other relatives here. Reverend Clifford Olsen told me he would adopt us. We transferred our membership, neither of us were Methodist, and became involved in church activities, Sunday School teaching, missions work, Bible School, and Trustees. Our boys were confirmed here and our arandkids dedicated here.

After 30+ years, we made a decision to go to Fond du Lac and transferred our membership to Salem United Methodist. We worked with the youth, taught Sunday School, involved in all missions, went to Red Bird 5 times and to Henderson Settlement once on summer mission trips. Our 3 grandsons were confirmed there and we made many wonderful and lasting friendships.

Then came the decision by the conference and the Bishop to go in a direction we weren't comfortable with and didn't believe. I, Nancy, have been called racist and addled in the brain, but that really isn't me. I just have strong beliefs regarding marriage, social justice issues (Black Lives Matter) and the LGBTQ community. They are welcome in any church I am associated with and they certainly can be friends, and are, but don't try to make me believe the same as they do and that they are right and I'm wrong, that doesn't work for me. When we read about what the Bishop was espousing and learned more about the direction of the "United" Methodist Church, that wasn't us! Salem was told to listen to Pastor Adam Hamilton speak on line and learn what the future of the church was going to be. I had several Bible studies written by Adam Hamilton and they were outstanding. He is so well respected and his mega church brings in thousand of people every Sunday, BUT what he had to say was contrary to my beliefs. Salem people never discussed the disaffiliation, never had a question and answer session, they were completely in the dark. Of course that didn't mean they couldn't find answers on their own, but many didn't. Since that was the case, we felt we should come back to Trinity or a church that was aware of the decisions the conference was proposing on gay marriage, gay pastors in the pulpit and the redefining of marriage in the Book of Discipline. Our children and grandchildren should be safe from woke, transgender ideas and not have "the church" support those ideas and proudly fly the rainbow flag.

This church was a home and haven to us and we will forever be grateful for having found Trinity Methodist. I think, as the song says, "We are one in the spirit, we are one in the Lord. We will walk and work with each other and all the time praying that all unity will one day be restored, and They'll know we are Christian by our love.




