The Cross Is Up the Tower at Trinity Methodist Church Dear Church Family and Friends,

It's hard to believe that 2025 is going by so fast, and we are already getting close to Fall. It feels like we just took down the Christmas decorations and made our New Year's resolutions; most of which we've probably forgotten by now (unless your goal was to eat more dessert, then you might be doing well!). And now, here we are, already thinking about pumpkins and jackets again! Time is moving quickly, and if we're not paying attention, it can feel like we're being left behind, just watching the days go by. Life gets very busy, doesn't it? Our schedules fill up with work, school, appointments, chores, and so many other things that seem important. Sometimes we get so busy that

In the midst of all this busyness, we must pause and be reminded of what truly matters. In the Bible, towers often represented strength, safety, and God's presence. Proverbs 18:10 says, "The name of the Lord is a strong tower; the righteous run to it and are safe." Our church tower is not just part of the building, it reminds us that God is our protection, the One we turn to in times of trouble.

And now, right at the top of the tower, a cross stands tall once again. The cross reminds us of Jesus, His love, His sacrifice, and His victory over sin and death. It tells the world that this is a place of hope and grace. Having the cross on top of our tower is our way of saying, "Jesus is the center of this church, and we will lift Him high." As Galatians 6:14 says, "May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Church Council Meeting Minutes

July 15, 2025

Reports Given -

Financial

• Quarterly statements will be mailed/emailed out the first week of August. If we have a valid email address on file, your statement will come that way.

- As of July 15, 2025, we are ahead of budget.
- Some investments have been liquidated to cover the cost of the steeple repair.

Sunday School

- The Sunday School rooms received a fresh coat of paint. Dan & Pam Dewhurst and Carissa Backhaus painted those rooms with donated paint.
- Tammy Steers picked up a new 24 book series with Jesus, a book of songs and four bibles for the younger children that Kathy will use.

Men's Group

- The Men's Group will provide refreshments and smores after church on August 17 by the tower.
- Pete Drexler will coordinate a golf outing for Kickoff Sunday

SPRC

• Glen W announced he will stay on as chairman of the Committee.

Cemeteries

• Doug Kiehnau reported he received a letter that STH 67 will be repaired in 2028. The sidewalk by the cemetery will be shut down until 2032.

Pastor's Report

- Pastor is planning to go on a Great Lakes Annual Conference Mission trip to Cuba from November 3-10, 2025. The trip will cost \$1600.75. A motion was made and seconded that this be paid out of his continuing education and pastoral office fund account.
- Confirmation class will start this fall.

New and Old Business

- Tower work was completed on 7/11/25 and the cross will be lifted back into place on 7/18/25. The tower needed to be lowered two feet more than originally thought, which raised the cost. LED lights may be installed at a later date.
- Parking Lot paving project will start in August for an estimated cost of \$150,000.

Fall Kickoff Sunday

• September 14 is slated to start our Fall Program. Fred Ferguson will lead us in worship, followed by an ice cream and pie social, Sunday School Kickoff, mum sale, and golf outing. A flyer will be sent via mail to Theresa, Lomira, and Brownsville residents.

New Committee being organized to create a consistent look across our various "Communication" tools like Facebook, TMC Website, Bulletin, Newsletter, Mailers, Yard Signs, Bulletin Boards, etc. First Meeting to be held on July 22.

Everything is dependent upon


the weather, but please plan your church visits accordingly as the parking lot will be closed during the daytime hours that week as the asphalt company will have large equipment working on the lot.






