


Hello Church Family,

This month we are going to look at the second of five questions on Giving to God from the 'New Living Translation – New Believer's Bible'. How much should you give? The answer: God encourages us to give sacrificially. In Mark 12:41-44 <sup>41</sup> 'Jesus went over to the collection box in the Temple and sat and watched as the crowds dropped in their money. Many rich people put in large amounts. <sup>42</sup> Then a poor widow came and dropped in two pennies. <sup>43</sup> Jesus called his disciples to him and said, "I assure you; this poor widow has given more than all the others have given. <sup>44</sup> For they gave

a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she has." Generosity is not measured by the size of the gift itself, but by the motivation. In this story, we see how Jesus valued the small offering of this poor widow over the large sums of money from the wealthy people. Jesus knew that she had given all she had. He could see that her heart was in the right place.

The great psalmist, David, king of Israel, said he would not give to the Lord that which cost him nothing. In other words, we are not to give our "leftovers" to God, but our best. When you think about it, is that really too much to ask? After all, he gave his best to us when he sent us his own dear Son to die in our place. Our attitude toward giving should be like that of the generous believers in Macedonia, who eagerly came to the aid of the church in Jerusalem during its time of need: "For I can testify that they gave not only what they could afford but far more. And they did it of their own free will. They begged us again and again for the gracious privilege of sharing in the gift for the Christians in Jerusalem" (2 Corinthians 8:3-4). When you question how much of your income should be spent on God's work, remember this promise from the book of Proverbs: "The generous prosper and are satisfied: those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed" (Proverbs 11:25).



Have you ever taken whatever it may be, even at the risk of damaging your own soul, simply to satisfy yourself? If you have, then you CANNOT pour it out "to the Lord". You can never set apart for God something that you desire for yourself to achieve your own satisfaction. If you try to satisfy yourself with a blessing from God, it will corrupt you. You must sacrifice it, pouring it out to God – something that our common sense says is an absurd waste. How can I pour out "to the Lord" ... there is only one way – I must make a determination in my mind to do so. And until I pour these things out to God, they actually endanger those I love, as well as myself, because they will be turned into lust. Yes, we can be lustful in things that are not sordid (dirty) or vile (evil). If you have become bitter and sour, it is because when God gave you a blessing you hoarded it. Yet if you had poured it out to Him, you would have been the sweetest person on earth. If you are always keeping blessings to yourself and never learning to pour them out "to the Lord," other people will never have their vision of God expanded through you. These words are from 'My Utmost for His Highest' by Oswald Chambers.

We must be willing to give what we have to the Lord, to fully open ourselves up to his TOTAL BLESSINGS. It must come from a thankful and gracious heart for God has given you so much. Everything you have and everything that happens to us is because of God. All things are an experience he needs us to learn from and be strengthened through, even the bad things in our lives. All things are part of His plan, and when you are able to fully accept that fact, it is extremely life changing. Just like the poor Widow in the story, she was not bitter or sour towards God for her poverty. She was so filled with Thanks and Love for God, giving up everything she had was worth it to her. I hope this message inspires you to Pray on this topic and let God work in you to meet His Will, however that may be. God is good all the time, and all the time, God is good.

#### **The physical shoebox**... such an important part of the project.

Each year the OCC Logistics Coordinator for our assigned area, Linda Feldman, reaches out for a count of how many shoeboxes we plan to pack as a group. We are then gifted boxes from Samaritan's Purse. The past couple years they were not able to grant our full box request. That's when our angel Laurie Malchow stepped in. Laurie reached out to a local company who shares a passion for the Operation Christmas Child Ministry. Supply One, out of Jackon, graciously offered to manufacture the shoeboxes we were short and gift them to us. We are VERY fortunate for the GENEROSITY of others!

Note in the picture of the unassembled shoeboxes, those at the bottom in cases were from Samaritan's Purse and when assembled are green and red. Those on top, counted out in groups of 50, were donated by Supply One and when assembled are red. Both boxes are adorned with a neat design and will be a gift itself to the recipient!
