Dear Trinity Family,

Winter has a way of testing our patience. Someone recently said to me, “*Pastor, winter feels longer than waiting in line at the church spaghetti dinner?*” I laughed, but I also realized something, even while we complain about the cold, God keeps giving us another sunrise every single day. We wake up. We breathe. We keep going. And that itself is grace.

So, again this month I begin with thanksgiving.

We thank God for the countless blessings that surround us, the gift of life, the gift of faith, and the gift of our church family. As we continue our Lenten journey, we walk together through the wilderness learning to see only Jesus... living with Him, walking with Him, suffering with Him, and trusting that we will also rise with Him. Lent reminds us that God is at work even when the road feels long and quiet.

I also want to thank all of you, the Trinity Methodist family, for your faithfulness. Your presence on Sundays and your participation in our church ministries and missions, and in Wednesday night gatherings of prayer and reflection are deeply encouraging. Each time we gather, we strengthen one another. Faith grows best when we walk together.

March also brings a meaningful opportunity for our church. On March 21, 2026, we will participate in the Feed My Starving Children Mobile Packing Event in Fond du Lac. Before inviting you to register, give, and pray, I want to share another thing very personal.

In the early 2000s, my wife Tshishinen and I served together as chaplains in war-displaced and refugee camps in the Congo. We met families who escaped with nothing but their lives. Some parents were separated from their children. Some children were left completely alone. And some children fled the camps and lived as street kids in the city just to survive. Hunger, fear, and uncertainty filled their days as they waited for meals sent from far away.

Because of desperation, young girls and widowed mothers became easy targets. I will never forget a painful reality we witnessed. Older men, so-called “sugar daddies,” would circle the camps like predators. They would approach young girls and single mothers with a cruel offer: money for survival in exchange for their bodies. The cost was their dignity, their safety, and often their health for few dollars. For someone who had not eaten, even five dollars felt like hope, yet it was a dangerous temptation at the lowest point of life.

As chaplains, we prayed with them, encouraged them by sharing the Word of God, and taught them to resist these offers, not only to protect their bodies, but to protect their future. In those moments we learned a deep spiritual truth: the enemy attacks when people are weak, hungry, and discouraged. But we also saw another truth, food is not just food. ***A simple meal can protect a life, restore dignity, and give strength to choose what is right.***

That is why ministries that provide meals like ‘**Feed my Starving Children**’ matter deeply. They do more than feed the stomach; they guard the heart and preserve hope. “*For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat.*” (Matthew 25:35) ***When we feed someone, we are not only meeting a physical need; we are also protecting a life God loves.***

This connects closely with our Lenten journey. Jesus Himself faced temptation when He was hungry in the wilderness. Hunger weakens the body, but compassion strengthens the soul. When we prepare meals for others, we become part of God’s answer to prayer in someone’s life. I invite you to prayerfully consider signing up to pack meals, giving toward the ministry, and praying for the children and families who will receive them.

This month, we keep walking through our sermon series, “*Seeing Jesus: From Ashes to Resurrection.*” Here is where we are going:

- March 1 — John 3:1-17: “*Seeing the Kingdom*”
- March 8 — John 4:5-14: “*Seeing the Source*”
- March 15 — John 9:1-41: “*Seeing the Light of the World*”
- March 22 — John 11:17-27: “*Seeing the Resurrection and the Life*”
- March 29 — Matthew 21:1-11: “*Seeing the Real King*”

Remember each Wednesday at 7:00 pm we will also continue our Lenten gatherings of prayer, meditation, and reflection. These quiet evenings help prepare our hearts so that Sunday worship becomes deeper and more personal.

Lent teaches us to slow down and fix our eyes on Christ. The cross reminds us that suffering is not the end of the story, and the resurrection reminds us that hope always has the final word.

Let us keep walking together in faith, trusting the One who walks ahead of us.

## **STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE OFFERING**

Hello Church Family, last month we finished the review of the five questions on 'Giving to God', and the lessons we can learn from those. Now that we finished that series, I want to write to you on something I have been thinking about for a long time, ever since I read the book of Jonah. How many of you have read the book of Jonah? Until this past year I never had. Sure, I remember the Sunday School lessons of Jonah and the whale, but that is all I could recall that he was swallowed up by a whale and lived. There is more to the story than that, this book of the Bible was really eye opening to me, how important a message God has for us in the words of Jonah.

God asked Jonah to go to the city of Nineveh and announce His judgement against this city for the people of this city were very wicked. Jonah though decided to run from what the Lord asked of him and boarded a boat going to Tarshish which was the opposite direction of Nineveh to get away from the Lord. The Lord caused a huge storm on the sea and eventually the others on the ship through him overboard into the sea. This is how Jonah and the whale came about; the Lord had a whale swallow up Jonah. Inside the whale Jonah prayed to God to rescue him: *Jonah 2:7-10 NLT* -<sup>7</sup> *"When I had lost all hope, I turned my thoughts once more to the Lord. And my earnest prayer went out to you in your holy Temple.* <sup>8</sup> *Those who worship false gods turn their backs on all God's mercies.* <sup>9</sup> *But I will offer sacrifices to you with songs of praise, and I will fulfill all my vows. For my salvation comes from the Lord alone."* <sup>10</sup> *Then the Lord ordered the whale to spit Jonah out onto the beach, and it did.*

In Chapter 3, God spoke to Jonah a second time to go to the city of Nineveh and deliver His message against the people of this great city. So, Jonah obeyed the command of the Lord this time. *Jonah 3:4-5 & 10 NLT* -<sup>4</sup> *On the day Jonah entered the city, he shouted to the crowds: "Forty days from now Nineveh will be destroyed".* <sup>5</sup> *The people of Nineveh believed God's message, and from the greatest to the least, they decided to go without food and wear sackcloth to show their sorrow.* <sup>10</sup> *When God saw that the people put a stop to their evil ways, he had mercy on them and didn't carry out the destruction he had threatened them.* The mercy God showed the city of Nineveh angered Jonah so much that he asked to die - *Jonah 4:3-4 NLT* -<sup>3</sup> *Just kill me now, Lord! I'd rather be dead than alive because nothing I predicted is going to happen".* God's answer to this request is a powerful one. <sup>4</sup> *The Lord replied, "Is it right for you to be angry about this?"*

The last part of Chapter 4 – verses 5-10 I am not going to give away, but there is a cliffhanger in it. There are only a few times in the Bible this happens, which I feel God wants us to really understand and learn something from the story of Jonah. I encourage you to take time to read the Book of Jonah. It's a short book of the Bible only 2 pages, 4 chapters in total and would only take a few minutes to read.



The first lesson I learned from reading Jonah is that we all in moments of our lives want to run from God, run from what we know is right in His eyes. We try to avoid Him, thinking that if we stay away from God, don't think about Him or what He wants us to do, that he will leave us alone. Though we may be able to think we escape, that is short lived. When God wants something from us or needs us to experience and learn something from Him, He will never give up. He is persistent, Hebrew 13:5 – "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake (abandon) you". It may be years that He allows us to avoid His presence but, in His time, His will does come through. What God wants us to experience and learn, we must.



Now the other lesson I took from this is the more difficult one. **When we do obey God's word and do as He asks, if He doesn't fulfill the promise the way we predicted, how we want God to, then we get angry and frustrated at Him.** Even more so when He shows mercy and grace to people we think are not deserving of it. This is very challenging for most of us, myself included, to accept what God has chosen to be so, when we don't think that's how it should happen. We need to remind ourselves of Jonah 4:4 and what God says to Jonah "Is it right for you to be angry about this?" What God so chooses for others, should not be of our concern. In the 'The Purpose Driven Life' it talks about this in reference to Matthew 20 and the parable Jesus told of the landowner who paid

all the workers the same wage whether they worked all day or just part of a day. Rick Warren put it this way – "Stop resenting my grace to others, be grateful for what you've got, and move on with your life now!". This is a very tough thing to do, as it is human nature to be jealous and/or angry with what others receive from God. I have been challenged to remind myself of these words, and I challenge all of you to do the same. Since this is part of our being, we will all be challenged in this area for years to come, it will take time, but take steps to change your way of thinking. Fulfill what God asks of you, and however He chooses to deal with others well, leave that to them and God, don't concern yourself with it. God has His own plan for each of us, and when we get to Heaven, we all will answer for our own sins, which is enough for each of us to deal with. I encourage you to read the book of Jonah and see how it moves you, I would love to get your take on it someday. I ask you to pray on this message and give your lives fully to God. God is good all the time, and all the time, God is good.

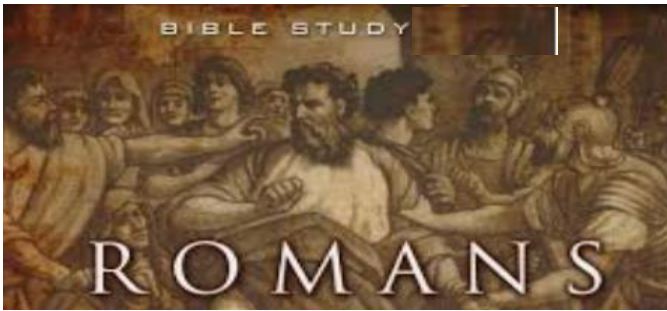
### January 25, 2026 Meeting Minutes

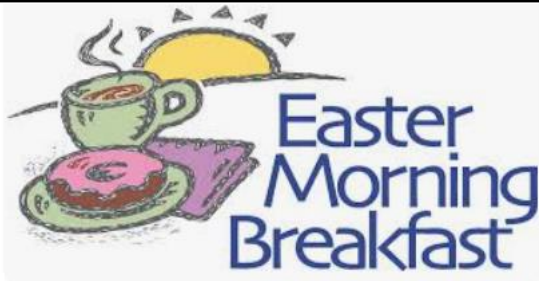
## BIBLE STUDY RETURNS—MARCH 2

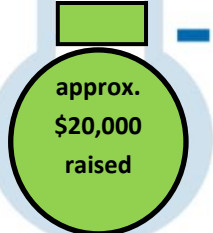

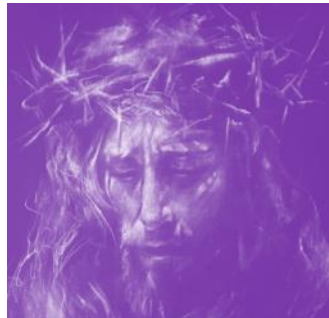

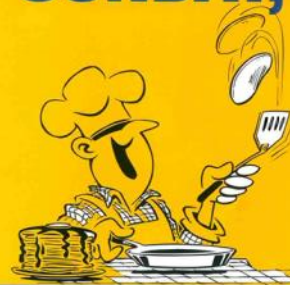
