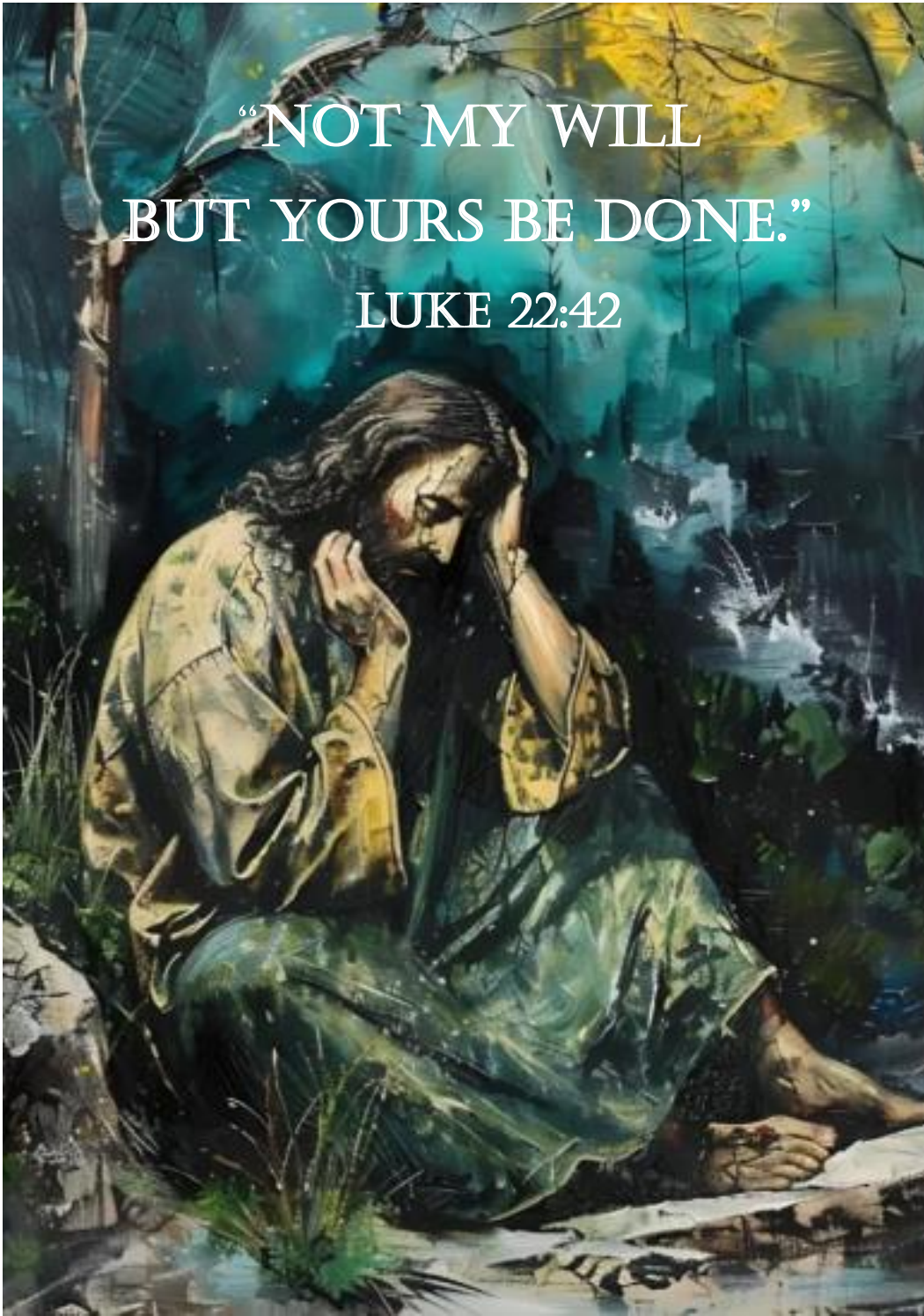

Dear friends and siblings in Christ,

Someone once said, 'In Wisconsin, if you don't like the weather, just wait five minutes.' That feels especially true in April! Here in Lomira, this season brings a mix of sunshine, rain, and sometimes even a last surprise snowfall. But slowly, the cold gives way to new life. And in many ways, that is also what God is doing in us, turning the seasons of our hearts from winter into spring.

As I reflect on this season, my heart is full of gratitude. First, I thank God, who continues to guide us, provide for us, and walk with us every step of the way. Without Him, we are nothing, but with Him, we have everything we need. His grace has carried us, His love has sustained us, and His faithfulness has never failed.

I am also deeply thankful for our church leadership, especially our Board of Trustees. We are seeing a great transformation around our church, and it is not by accident. It is the result of faithful hands, caring hearts, and a shared vision to make our church a welcoming and vibrant place for all. Your work does not go unnoticed, and it is making a difference.

A special word of thanks goes to our administrative assistant. The way she organizes, supports, and helps carry the daily work of the church makes everything flow smoothly. She helps turn ideas into action and keeps our mission moving forward. It is truly a blessing to do ministry together with her.

I also want to thank everyone who gave their time, energy, and resources for Feed My Starving Children. To those who packed meals, who donated, and who prayed, thank you. Your love has reached far beyond our walls and touched lives we may never see on this side of heaven. That is the beauty of God's work.

To those who joined our Wednesday night Lenten gatherings of prayer and reflection, thank you for showing up, for seeking God, and for walking this spiritual journey together. These moments of prayer have strengthened our faith and deepened our connection with Christ and with one another.

And to all our church members, thank you. Thank you for your faithfulness, your generosity, your prayers, and your presence. You are the heart of this church. Together, we are living out God's call to love, grow, and serve. As Scripture reminds us, "*Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus*" (1 Thessalonians 5:18).

As we move through April, we enter into the most sacred time of our Christian journey. We begin with Maundy Thursday. The word 'Maundy' comes from the Latin word for 'commandment.' On this holy night, Jesus gave us a new commandment: to love one another as He has loved us. Around the table, He shared His last meal with His disciples and revealed the true meaning of love through humble service. Our service at 6:00 pm will center on the devotional '*Seeing the Servant's Heart*,' inspired by John 13:1-17, 31-35 and the Holy Communion. This is the seventh step in our series, '*Seeing Jesus: From Ashes to Resurrection*.' It is a sacred moment for us to pause, reflect, and learn again what it means to serve as Christ served.

The next evening, we gather for Good Friday, when we remember the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. It is called 'good' because it is the day our salvation was won. It is a solemn day, yet filled with deep meaning, for through His suffering, we receive life. Our service at 6:00 pm will once again tell the story of Jesus' passion through readings and hymns, much like we did last year. It is a powerful time for us to walk together through the story of the cross.

Then comes Easter, the day of victory, hope, and new life. We will gather for breakfast before our 9:00 am service, sharing joy and fellowship as a church family. Our worship will bring us to the end of our series, "*Seeing Jesus: From Ashes to Resurrection*," with the message "*Seeing the Risen Lord*," inspired by John 20:1-18. On this day, we celebrate that the tomb is empty and that Christ is alive!

The journey doesn't end on Easter morning. Our joy continues as we prepare for Confirmation Sunday. On April 12, our sermon will be "*When Jesus Stands Among Us*," based on John 20:19-31. Then, on April 19, we will walk with our Lord in the sermon "*On the Road with Jesus*," based on Luke 24:13-35.

Finally, we will celebrate Confirmation Sunday on April 26th. Our main scripture will be Colossians 2:6–7: “So then, just as you received Christ Jesus as Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him, strengthened in the faith as you were taught, and overflowing with thankfulness.” On this special day, each confirmand will share his or her own spiritual journey. It will be a testament to the living, breathing faith that grows among us.


As we take part in all these events, let us remember the heart of it all: Jesus. From the upper room, to the cross, to the empty tomb, His love is the thread that holds it all together. As Scripture says, “Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith” (Hebrews 12:2).

My prayer for you this April is that you will see Jesus more clearly, love Him more deeply, and follow Him more faithfully. May this season refresh your spirit, renew your hope, and remind you that God is always at work, even in the changing seasons of life.

Let us move forward together with faith, gratitude, and joy, trusting in the promise of God’s Word: “See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?” (Isaiah 43:19).

STEWARDSHIP AND FINANCE OFFERING

Hello Church Family, last month we reflected on the book of Jonah and I told you about two of the lessons I took from Jonah. First lesson was how we all may want to run from God, and the second lesson is how we handle what God does in our lives. There is something that ties both these lessons together from the book of Jonah. It is what shows up countless times, reappearing in the Bible, over and over again. That is the **LOVE** that God has for people. Jonah repents in the belly of the fish and God comes back to him. The people of Nineveh repented to God and he spared their lives.

While I have been reading the Old Testament, there is story, after story of how God becomes angry with the people that he has chosen. They disobey and sin, and God punishes them, lets them fend for themselves, and over time God comes back to them, most the time through prayer and repentance. Then the cycle starts all over again. Look at when God delivered the Israelites from Egypt...God was going to give them a promised land of milk and honey. But when Moses was up on the mountain for 40 days and nights some of the people turned on God thinking he had forsaken them and they created idols instead. All those who disobeyed were killed (see Exodus 32). Before entering the promised land 12 spies were sent out to survey the land. They all agreed it was a wonderful land but 10 of the spies

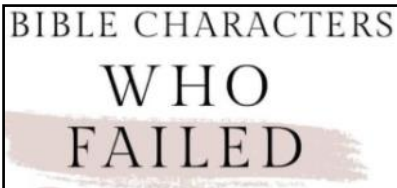
also saw the people living in the land and were fearful they would not be able to take the land from those people. Only Joshua and Caleb of the 12 spies believed in the Lord. The people rebelled against Moses, and the punishment was for the adults to wander in the wilderness for 40 years and never enter the promise land since the people would not believe in God. Only Joshua and Caleb ever lived in the promise land of the adults. In the book of Judges there are several stories where the people forget about God, about all the things he had done in the past for them. They did evil and sinful things, but yet God never stopped fighting for His people. He continually came back to them and showed them how good life can be when they follow and obey God. King David committed adultery and murder, then when confronted by Nathan, King David repented (see Psalms 51) and God was there for him. Think of the story of the prodigal son, how happy the farther was when the son returned. What about when Peter denied knowing Jesus 3 times, he was so ashamed he went back to being a fisherman, then after Jesus's resurrection he sought out Peter and brought him back to the ministry of God.

I often think while reading the Bible how could these people of God not learn their lessons, learn from past failures. God does so much for them and yet they turn their backs on Him, again and again. Some of us lead a life closer to Job which if you are one of those people glory to you, you are a good and faithful servant and God knows all you do in His name. Not to say you don't sin, but you are more focused on God daily than others. Many of us though, continually make mistakes, sometimes the same sin repeatedly. You lose sight of God in moments in your lives, sometimes it's for a split second and we let frustration slip out a curse word or take the Lord's name in vain, find ourselves gossiping, or have envy of our neighbors.

Other times it may be days or weeks, and sometimes years that we turn from God, forgetting what we have learned, going down the wrong path, lost faith. The comforting part...God never gives up on us, He is always seeking us out. Jessica and I have been watching the series "The Chosen" and it is a great reminder about the importance of repenting of our sins, and asking for forgiveness. No matter what you are going through, God is there for you if you want Him to be. It is never too late to follow God's commands, to trust, obey, and have Faith. I ask you to pray on this message and give your lives fully to God. God is good all the time, and all the time, God is good.

Meeting called to order. Pastor M opened with a prayer. Agenda and minutes were approved.

Reports given:

Memorials— working on illuminating the exterior of church by adding more lighting

Christian Education - Youth

- Palm Sunday - children will sing
- Confirmation Sunday - April 26, 2026
- Vacation Bible School - May 1 & 2
- Mother's Day - last day of Sunday school
- Scholarship - received a \$15,000 donation to the Scholarship Fund. Discussion was had that the continuing education scholarship could be received more than once. More guidelines on scholarships may be added in the future.

Christian Education - Adult

- The book of Romans study started again on Monday, March 2. New participants are welcome at any time. Study is held on Mondays from 1:00-2:00pm. at church.
- The eight week study on "Grace", led by Deb Wiedmeyer, finished at the end of February. The study was attended by 7-8 participants.
- Adult Sunday School continues to meet prior to service Sunday mornings @ 7:30a.m. The group is studying making church members church disciples.

SPRC - Glen Wellso announced that Mark Harmon will fill in on May 17th to cover for Pastor Mulongo's vacation.

Compassionate Fund - Jackie Robinson, Bruce Sterr, and Tim Ferguson were noted as community contacts.

Pastor's report - discussed upcoming Confirmation Sunday, shut-ins visited, GMC Conference in Green Lake, vacation May 12-18

Trustee projects: Wayde gave estimates for parsonage - water softener and sump pump

Church updates: recommended paint sanctuary, updated lighting, and clean carpets all projects approved .

Update Furniture: Tammy Steers, Bill Buske, and Pam Dewhurst will explore replacing furniture in the Sunshine Room.

Trinity Church Grounds Preservation Fund - announcement made that a 5-year annual endowment was received from a generous anonymous donor. TMC will receive \$20,000 per year for the next five years to work on general grounds improvements. This summer, work will take place in the TMC woods.

Easter Breakfast - the Men's Group will run Easter Breakfast, which will be served from 8:00am—8:30am. A signup sheet was passed looking for volunteers and donations of coffee cakes.

Bell Choir 30th Anniversary celebration is being planned for June 7, 2026. Current and former bell members will be invited to attend the service. More details to follow.

Sound System - new speaker installation will be May 4-8. An additional cost of \$246 will be incurred due to the updated version of equipment.

Safety protocols - Wayde Beck attended the House of Worship Security Program. Wayde has also had a discussion on implementing possible safety measures with Kurt Stuckart, a Brownsville police officer .

Advertising—Becky Alf reported there is no cost to advertise church services in the Dodge County Pioneer.

Leave a Legacy to TMC

Have you ever thought about leaving a legacy to TMC and not sure where you should start?

Here are a few helpful hints to get you started:

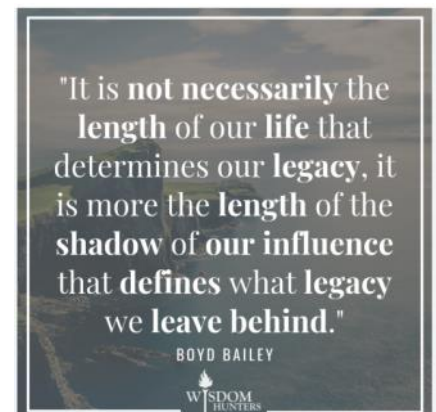
Gather information about your assets, including retirement funds, bank accounts and real property.

Choose the type of bequest you'd like to make:

- A) Unrestricted bequest - this is a donation to be used for TMC general funds. The donation would be used where it is most needed.
- B) Restricted bequest - this donation specifies how the money is to be used. (This could be restricted to go into an endowment, a specific use, or renovation fund.)

A bequest can be made in a number of ways:

- Specific dollar amount
- Specific assets such as securities, real estate, or tangible property.
- Retirement account assets consisting of any benefits remaining in your retirement plan.
- A residuary bequest - TMC receives all or a percentage of your estate after all obligations are met.
- An existing will or trust can be easily amended to include a gift to TMC without rewriting the entire document, called a codicil, which adds a new bequest while reaffirming the terms of your will. Your attorney can prepare an amendment to a revocable trust to add TMC.
- Meet with your estate planning attorney as they can best advise you.
- All bequests to TMC are fully deductible for estate tax purposes.





Trustee Corner

The Trustee team wants to keep you informed of all the current projects that they have under way.

Not only did they spearhead repaving the parking lot and restructuring the bell tower last summer, they have a handful of projects planned for this spring and summer to keep the church, parsonage and grounds in top shape.

Below is a list of this year's projects:

Parsonage:

- **Replaced the water softener and sump pump**
Maxwell Plumbing and Heating performed the work.

Church Projects:

- **Taking down trees in the TMC Woods - we will be utilizing this year's \$20,000 endowment (of the anonymous 5 year - \$100,000 endowment) which is to be used exclusively for the maintenance and enhancement of the church and parsonage property.**
- **Spring Clean-Up Day**—as the weather becomes more favorable, we'll be looking for volunteers to help us clean up the church grounds.
- **Clean the tile floors in Fellowship Hall and hallways.** We had a company out of West Bend come and clean two tiles and draw up a quote on what it would take to maintain the floors.
- **The "dusk to dawn" lights** on the exterior of the church will be getting new fixtures as some of them are not working or are broken.

Luke Luedtke Electric will be undertaking the installation.
- **Painting the Sanctuary** - price quotes are being obtained to paint the Sanctuary and Connections Room.
- **Cleaning the carpets** - after the painting is complete, carpets will be cleaned in the offices, hallway, sanctuary, and Connections Room.
- **Updating the furniture** - a committee is looking into updating the furniture in the Connections Room and Sunroom.
- **Repair the mailbox** that was taken down by the snow plow.
- **Update church emergency lights** that were not functioning properly.
- **Church Mutual** insurance Inspection
- **Pest control**
- **Daily repairs**
- **Bathroom floor cleaning**

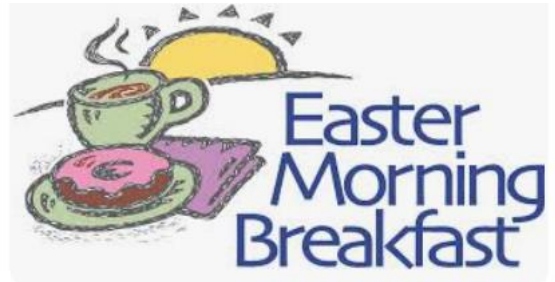

Day 7: Black Saturday

Jesus' body lays in the tomb and is treated for burial; disciples come out of hiding and mourn openly.
 (Matthew 27:62-66, Mark 16:1, Luke 23:56, and John 19:40)

Day 8: Resurrection Day

Multiple eyewitness accounts of Jesus having resurrected and the discovery of empty tomb.
 (Matthew 28:1-13, Mark 16:1-14, Luke 24:1-49, and John 20:1-23)
