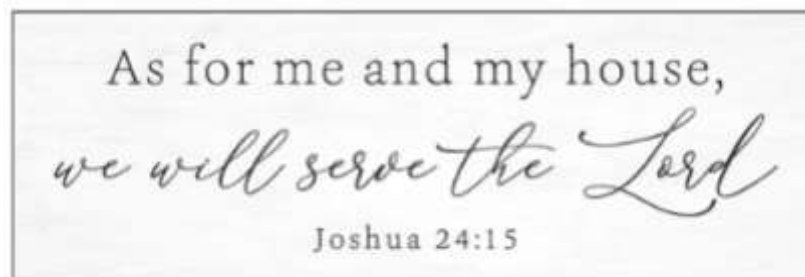

# Stewardship and Finance Offering

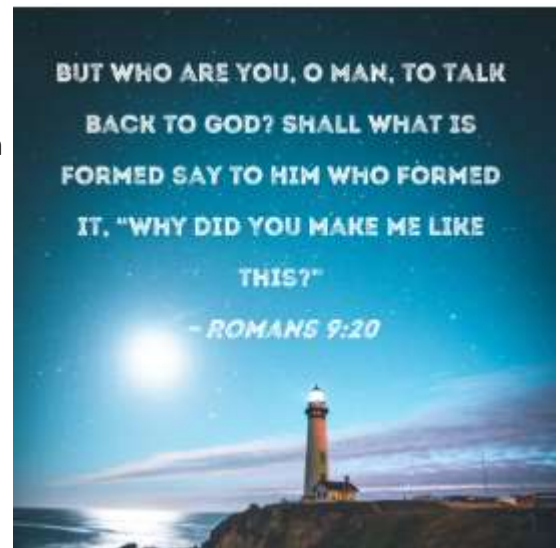
Hello Church Family, last month I wrote to you about the 'Love of Money' and being content with what God has given each of us in our own lives. That wanting more because of what your neighbor or family members have is wrong in God's eyes. This month I am going to start a series of articles on ENVY! I read a chapter in the book 'The Purpose Driven Life' by Rick Warren about envy and it really made me think, how much of mine and probably all our lives are wasted dealing with envy. In Proverbs 14:30 (NIV) *A heart of peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones.* In Ecclesiastes 4:4 (NLT) *Then I observed that most people are motivated to success because they envy their neighbors. But this, too, is meaningless – like chasing the wind.* Rick Warren says "You cannot fulfill **God's purpose for your life**, if you envy the lives of others." He goes on to say – "While God created each of us for the same five eternal purposes (worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry, and evangelism), the way you fulfill those purposes - the time, place, plan, and style - is absolutely unique. God never creates clones, never copies what he's already made, and never duplicates a life plan. God only creates original masterpieces. God distinctively *shaped* you for a life unlike any other. Only you can be you. Only you can live the life God designed you to live. But it's also true that you cannot live a life that God designed for someone else. *To attempt to be what you weren't created to be always leads to frustration, fatigue, and failure.*"



Too often we fall into the 'Envy Trap', worrying about, and wanting what others have or are receiving. They have the new phone, a better job, nicer cars and homes. Their kids get more than yours, their vacations are better, they are better looking, more fit, and so on. It is human nature to be interested in each other's lives, there is nothing wrong with that, but when you let envy start to creep into our minds and lives and become jealous over others, that's when we move away from God. Instead of looking at their lives and being happy for them and celebrating their successes with them, we diminish them. When we do that it never really makes us feel happier, it just makes us bitter. God wants his people to be kind and loving, to reflect what we learn from Jesus. When we envy others, we cannot do this. Envy shifts our focus from the plans that God has for us, because we are so stuck on the idea of keeping up with everyone else. If your mind is on what everyone else is doing, how will we ever be able to listen and see the great things God is doing in our lives. Think of it like this, remember back when you were in school or maybe a work meeting just the other day; something sidetracks your mind and you are focused on that daydream, instead of being in the moment of what the teacher or coworker is presenting. What ends up happening...you miss out on what is going on right in front of you. If we are not focused on God's plan for our lives, how will we be ready to act when he calls on us? How will we be able to rejoice in the blessings he bestows upon us? If we are so focused on envying others. Envy can be so destructive in our lives God made it one of the Ten Commandments, Exodus 20:17 tells us "You shall not covet".

When we have envy, we are saying to God that he screwed up with us. That he should have done things differently for us. This is like a slap in the face to God, how is our plan greater than His. Romans 9:20 (NLT) *“Who are you, a mere human being, to argue with God? Should the thing that was created say to the one who created it, ‘Why have you made me like this?’”* How can we think we have a better plan than God. Romans 9:23 (NLT) *He has the right to pour out the riches of his glory upon those he prepared to be the objects of His mercy.* We do not know God’s will for us or others, and frankly we don’t need to, we are asked to be good stewards of what He provides us and to be good disciples of God, and that is all we need to be concerned with in our lives. If others seem to have it all and we must struggle through hardships, then so be it. My dad always told me that just because it looks like they have everything, doesn’t mean they don’t have piles of credit card debit or bank loans to have all that stuff. I feel that God prepares us through the challenges He puts in our lives, and each one builds upon the last. It’s ok to have less than others, because what we have is what God wants us to have in this moment. **It’s what we do with what He provides us that really matters!** Maybe if we started focusing on our own lives and not be envious of others, we would be able to see the blessings that God is trying to give us, we need to **OPEN OUR EYES** to God. Let’s face it, if we are only ever going to be happy when good things happen in our lives how can we lead content lives. Struggles and failures happen every day. If you can start to truly be happy when good things happen in others lives than we will have so many more reasons to be happy in life. Celebrate in the blessings of others, see how God works in this world, **LET** your life be happy. I ask you to pray on this message and give your lives fully to God. God is good all the time, and all the time, God is good.

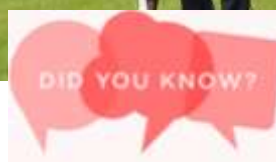

# COUNCIL MINUTES

May 19, 2026

Meeting called to order by Chairman Buske at 6:00 p.m. Pastor Mulongo opened with prayer.

II. Approve agenda and minutes.

## III. Reports

A. Compassionate Fund (Deb Zinniel). See Lomira Food Pantry page—donations are well ahead of last year.

B. Financial (Deb Zinniel). Report submitted. - currently, we owe \$143,000 on the parking lot.

C. Finance (Josh Marshie). Refer to the May newsletter.

D. Treasurer (John Lavarda). Report submitted.

E. Memorials. No report.

F. SPRC (Glen Wellso). A special thanks to Mark Harmon for presiding over the services last week.

G. Christian Education

a. Sunday School (Carissa Backhaus). The Mother's/Father's Day service was well-received. Procedures for administering background checks for adults who work with the children are being considered. Seven young adults confirmed April 26.

b. Adult (Kathy Drexler). Twelve to fifteen people attended the Monday afternoon Bible Study, the Book of Romans, which has recently concluded. Bible Study will restart on 09/14 and run for 12 weeks until 11/30. Adult Sunday School studied the book "Membership to Discipleship", during their last session. When resuming on 09/30, they will examine The Book of Acts.

H. Trustees (Wayde Beck). The insurance company report can be emailed to any interested member. Any minor issues that the fire department brought to the church's attention via inspection have been corrected. The air conditioning system was inspected. Tree removal is complete. The undergrowth will be addressed next, along with church building's landscaping.

Fleischman Excavating has agreed to fix a low spot by the church tower as a donation to the church. Trustees will discuss how to show gratitude.

Men's Group (Pete Drexler). They recently purchased a 2nd DVD /Blue ray player for the church. Plans for fall include a performance by Fred Ferguson at the September 13th service, a golf outing on September 20th at The Fields of Clover Hill, and a church apparel sale.

J. Pastor report (Pastor Mulongo). Report submitted.

## IV. New Business

A. Church safety (Mark Hodny). First aid kits were donated by Walgreens and placed in the kitchen and office. An AED is in the Connections Room. Currently, Deb Bintzler-Oestrich is trained on using the device, but having others trained is advisable. Weather safety will be addressed next. Adding a "Safety Corner" blurb in the bulletin is being considered.

B. Sanctuary color/floor polishing (Wayde Beck). After discussion and a vote on color, a motion was made to paint the church off-white. Bathroom tile and grout cleaning were completed in March. Floor polishing estimates were shared. A decision on polishing will be made after painting is complete.

C. VBS and Sunday School (Carissa Backhaus). The topic of VBS was Tropical Trek. About 21 students participated. The students and numerous volunteers enjoyed the experience. Attendance improved greatly when VBS was held in May vs the summer.

D. Easter breakfast report (Lee Oestrich). About 50 people attended the breakfast. Lee recommends continuing the event.

E. June 7th Bells 30th Anniversary Celebration (Clarice Drummond). The celebration will honor past and current players and supporters with a performance and a write-up.

F. Sound system (John Muentner). All invoices have been submitted. Along with noticeably better equipment, two portable packs and an additional charging unit were received. Training will be provided for anyone interested in running the control board. The old hearing assist system is being kept as a back-up. A projector estimate will be obtained in the future.

G. Scholarships (Carissa Backhaus). May 31st is Graduation / Scholarship Sunday. One high school and five continuing education scholarships will be awarded. More precise language will be used in the future to highlight the continuing education scholarship guidelines.

H. New Directory (Mary Muehlius). A low-key approach to the directory is preferred over hiring a professional to take photographs.

I. Lights on tower. Gary Jesse would like to see the new tower lit with lights on the top. Wayde Beck noted that the lights are not recommended as the top of the tower is sealed as water infiltration deteriorated the tower in the past. Ground lights are installed.

## V. Old Business

A. Update on furniture (Pam Dewhurst). No forward movement until church is painted.

**VI. Closing** - The next meeting is Tuesday, July 21st, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. John Muentner led a closing prayer.

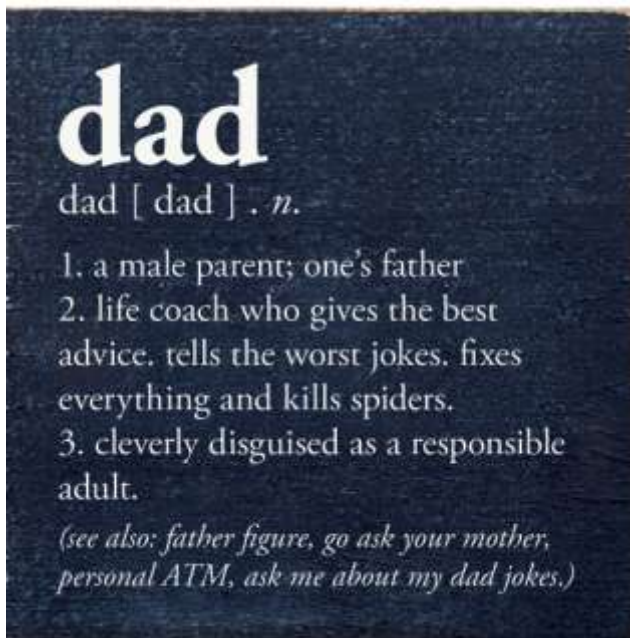

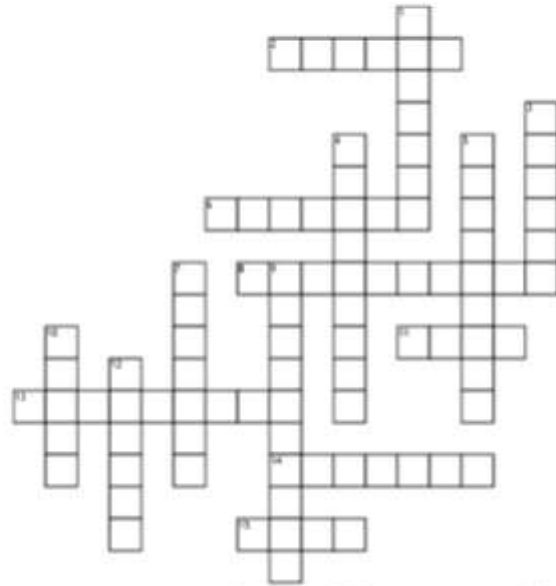
